
The seventh event in the OVCAA's Balangkas Symposium Series, the Symposium on PATD examines how UP's policy on public access to theses and dissertations has been implemented. Said policy is articulated in Article 7 (Theses and Dissertations) of UP's 2011 Revised Intellectual Property Rights Policy. The protocols regarding PATD were further explicated via issuances from the Office of the UP President (Memorandum No. PAEP 2012-03) and the OVCRD (Memorandum No. BMP 12-011 and Memorandum No. FRN 15-038). Now on its fourth year of implementation, the policy on PATD merits looking into, hence the symposium.

The symposium is being organized by the University Library to serve as a venue for discussing experiences, by the colleges/units and by the UP offices, regarding the implementation of the public access policy. The symposium is envisioned to serve as a venue for threshing out policy issues and gathering recommendations from UP Diliman constituents on how to address said issues. While the symposium is open to general recommendations, it also takes particular interest in recommendations that would strengthen the University Library's role as the primary institutional digital repository of UP Diliman.
